We are one of only a few departments in the United States where the faculty teaches **exclusively in French** at the graduate level.

Recent graduate courses have been devoted to the conflicted Enlightenment, poetry from the Pleiade to Ponge, the passions in 17th-Century France, the Algerian war, and seduction in the Middle Ages.

Our graduate students are awarded teaching assistantships that include a **stipend** and a **tuition waiver** and give them valuable experience in French language pedagogy.

Our students have recently held **internships** at the French Consulate and the famous Newberry Library.

Chicago's splendid Art Institute, Lyric Opera, Facets Multimedia, and vibrant theater life are all within easy reach.

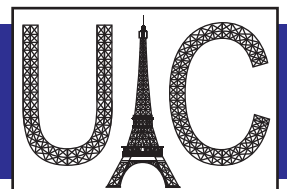
